

Political Development Forum

Political development is a multi-dimensional process and aims to consolidate the idea of citizenship, achieve integration and stability within society, increase the participation of citizens in political life, and strengthen the capacity of the state to implement its laws and policies in the country. Taking into account the separation of the three legislative, executive and judicial branches of the State.

Through the annual Political Development Forum, the Bahrain Institute for Political Development (BIPD) seeks to promote the national political culture in society through a gradual transition from the old to the modern. The forum constitutes a cycle of development within society that is compatible with a civilized world, bearing in mind that each society is controlled by its social and cultural conditions, and its experience is not linked to specific criteria, because accepting specific criteria means defining the development process within a certain framework

The Forum is an effective platform to form political perceptions of citizens by providing an opportunity for dialogue and civilized scientific debate among the public and a cultural elite representing intellectual cadres of national, Gulf and Arab, they together constitute a platform for creative discussion on political affairs, issues and focus on enlighten citizens' on the importance of these issues.

The general objective of the forum

- Promoting a culture of political development in the Bahraini society to enable it to contribute effectively to the decision-making process.
- Developing political knowledge and getting informed with the latest developments in political development.

Political Development Forum: "Bahrain: Belonging and Citizenship"

The forum's theme this year, entitled "Bahrain: Belonging and Citizenship", focuses on an important issues facing modern societies, namely the matter of belonging and its relationship to the citizenship.

The forum's vision is based on the Royal vision: linking loyalty and national belonging to the concept of the state, while preserving the national constants and consolidate the values of citizenship and adherence to identity with the values, customs, traditions and legacies it represents to build the present and looking forward to the future.

This will be through a series of panel discussions on the matter of national belonging from different perspectives and the role of those national institutions and its key components in promoting that affiliation.

- Developing a national political vision that considers the values, traditions and customs of society.

Session I: Citizenship, Family and Education

Family and school constitute the most important environment to which the citizen belongs, lives among its members, falls under its influence and listens to their guidance.

The family is the first social and psychological originator of the citizen.
The school is the first official tool of the national upbringing.

Both may work on their positive side to form citizens with a high degree of national belonging and a sense of citizenship, and they may work on their negative side to form people characterized by helplessness, distrust, alienation, isolation, violence and aggressiveness.

Many countries, especially Bahrain, have paid attention to the family's role and the compulsory and free education, not only in order to raise the social level of the members of society, but also in order to raise the generations to conform to the values of good citizenship and national belonging.

Has the family in the Kingdom been able to maintain its influential role on their children, or are other institutions assuming this role?

To what extent is the role of the Bahraini family approaching or away from forming the values of loyalty and national belonging in the hearts of their children? What are the aspects of this in the behavior of the Bahraini family?

Has the school been able to play this pivotal role in the upbringing process?

How was the educational institution able to reconcile being the first official institution of national formation and being the second means - after the family - in addressing the negatives of upbringing in the family - if any- ?
